Japan Foreign Trade Council, Inc. Celebrate 60th Year Anniversary

Japan Foreign Trade Council, Inc. held a 60th Year Anniversary Reception on May 28th in Imperial Hotel, Tokyo inviting a plenty of guests in business, government and academic spheres. The Fuji Room was filled with some 600 participants including foreign ambassadors and counselors from 53 different countries.

Mr. Mikio Sasaki, chairman of JFTC, delivered an opening address appreciating the earnest supports extended to the activities of JFTC. The ceremony was followed by an introduction of congratulatory message from the Prime Minster Shinzo Abe and a message from Mr. Akira Amari, Minister of Economy, Trade and Industry. Mr. Yasuo Hayashi, chairman, Japan External Trade Organization, gave a toast on behalf of invited guests.

Opening Speech by JFTC Chairman

Greetings by Chairman Mikio Sasaki, at the Reception to Celebrate the 60th Anniversary of the Japan Foreign Trade Council, Inc.

I am delighted to have this opportunity to say a few words at this reception to celebrate the 60th anniversary of the Japan Foreign Trade Council. Inc. (JFTC). First, let me thank you all for taking time out of your busy schedules to attend this gathering today. I also May 31, 2007



wish to take this opportunity to express my sincere appreciation to you for your continued understanding and support of our activities.

The JFTC celebrates its 60th anniversary this June. Over these sixty years, we have witnessed the development of Japan as a leading country in the area of trade and investment. This is not to say, however, that it has been smooth sailing.

We have faced many trials. The 1970s saw the shift to a floating exchange rate and two oil crises. In the 1980s, Japan was criticized for its trade surplus and the yen rapidly appreciated with the Plaza Accord. The 1990s were the so-called Lost Decade, which was sparked by the collapse of the bubble economy.

Shosha, overcame these various hardships through constant management measures and private- and publicsector efforts to address trade issues. Over these years, the JFTC ascertained the changes of the times and the needs of the world, considered the proper role of shosha, and made infrastructure improvements and policy proposals for *shosha* activities. Permit me to mention a few recent activities. The JFTC is actively urging the government to promote the conclusion of FTAs and EPAs, to prevent international double payment of corporate taxes and social insurance premiums for people stationed overseas, as well as to simplify and digitalize trade procedures and raise their efficiency.

The JFTC also places emphasis on social action programs. We established Action for a Better International Community, or "ABIC," seven years ago. With a core of former *shosha* employees, ABIC currently has more than 1,600 active members, all of whom energetically engage in activities in the front line of economic and cultural interchange and education in Japan and overseas, using their vast experience and knowledge.

Japan today faces a declining population. For the nation to continue to achieve sustainable development in the future, we are being called to create a new frontier that both develops increasingly global trade and investment activities and incorporates economic vitality from overseas.

It is here that *shosha* have a role to play. *Shosha* will actively develop a new frontier in response to the demands of the new era and contribute to the vitalization of Japan's economy and the healthy development of the world economy. Based on this perspective, the JFTC currently uses "Global Frontier" as the slogan for its

To commemorate the landmark of our 60th anniversary, we are now formulating a midterm vision for trade and investment. To create this vision, we are projecting Japan's trade and investment ten years hence and examining what we should do to achieve that. The results of this exercise are scheduled to be announced at the end of this year and will set the direction for our activities into the future.

In Japan, the 60th birthday is the occasion of *kanreki*, when five cycles of the Chinese zodiac have been completed and a new cycle is begun. The JFTC is determined to return to its original ideals and work toward the further development of Japan as a leading country in the area of trade and investment.

I ask for your continued understanding and support of our organization.

Congratulatory Message from Minister Amari

Mr. Toru Ishida, Director General of Trade and Economic Cooperation Bureau, METI, read the following message from the Minister who was due to come to the reception but resulted in absence owing to the extended Diet session on the day.



It is indeed a happy occasion that the Japan Foreign Trade Council, Inc. (JFTC) will celebrate its Sixtieth Anniversary this June, and I offer you my heartfelt congratulations.

Beginning in the middle of the twentieth century, Japan staked its future on international trade, achieved remarkably rapid economic development, and has played a leading role as an engine of global economic growth ever since. Last year's exports topped 75 trillion yen, a record high. The value of Japan's total trade, exports and imports included, is now double what it was ten years ago, and there is no question that the business of international trade will continue to play a very important role in Japan's economic prosperity.

Businesses of international trade have been resolutely promoting "selection and concentration" and innovating in the business models, while engaging in the proposition and structuring of projects and strategic investment. I would like to once again express my respect for the activities of all the members of the JFTC in this regard. In recent years, as a result of progress in the liberalization of trade and investment, global supply-chain systems have developed and the mutually interdependent relations among nations have strengthened. But, at the same time, the global competition has intensified and the resource nationalism has risen more apparently.

The Government of Japan is working to create a favorable business environment in overseas markets in a variety of ways: by bringing the WTO Doha Round to a conclusion this year, by active engagement in strengthening our economic partnership in East Asia and with resource-rich nations, and through the provision of ODA and trade insurance.

I hope that the government and the private sector will continue to work together actively in areas such as "resource diplomacy (strengthening relations with resource-rich nations)" and international cooperation in the fields of environmental issue and energy conservation.

In closing, as the JFTC celebrates its sixtieth year, I would like to offer both my congratulations and my hope that it will continue to grow, expand its networks both in Japan and overseas, and continue its contribution to the development of the Japanese economy and, by extension, the global economy.
